The applicant is informed that submitting the below documents does not guarantee issuance of the visa and that possession of a visa does not confer a right of entry.

9. Compulsory travel medical insurance valid for all Schengen countries with		
a coverage of at least CHF 50'000 or EURO 30'000 for the whole duration of		
the stay in Schengen area. Applicants who travel to Schengen area must		
bring the original insurance policy together with their passport, as they might		
be asked to present it on any Schengen border.		
11. Visa application fee: Euro 60 (equivalent in VND) to be paid when submitting		
the visa application. It covers the visa fee in case of visa approval and		
procedure fees in case of visa denial. No refund is possible!		
12. An original letter (or directly faxed) of a recognised travel organisation in		
Switzerland stating the full names, exact addresses, e-mail, phone/fax		
number and occupations of all participants.		
13. Detailed package tour with programme and itinerary - names and		
addresses of hotels, and full payment confirmation of the tour issued by the		
operator.		
14. Hotel reservations.		
15. Business Register of the Tour Operator in Vietnam

It is responsibility of each operator to sell package tours only to genuine visitors to Switzerland and Europe. Problems arising with participants who do not return to Vietnam after their stay as scheduled will have the tour operator blacklisted.
